The project Green-4-Future

The ERASMUS+ project Green-4-Future is a strategic partnership in vocational education and training (VET) funded by the European Commission. It aims to align economic goals with environmental and climate goals. Core idea of the project is to reconsider the EntreComp Framework that was developed by the Joint Research Centre, the European Commission's in-house science service. It is about greening of the EntreComp Framework.

In addition to the creation of a Green EntreComp Framework, the partners will focus on Business Modelling for Circular Economy Businesses, aim to create an In-Service-Training for VET Tutors and design a Green-4-Future MOOC.

The nine project partners are coming from Germany, Cyprus, Croatia, Austria, Ireland, Romania, Greece, Bulgaria and Portugal. The Coordinator is the University Paderborn, Chair of Business and Human Resource Education II. The other partners are universities, research organisations and VET institutions. So Green-4-Future comprises 4 universities, 3 research centres/institutes, 2 VET training institutions and all work in the field of VET and Green Entrepreneurship.
